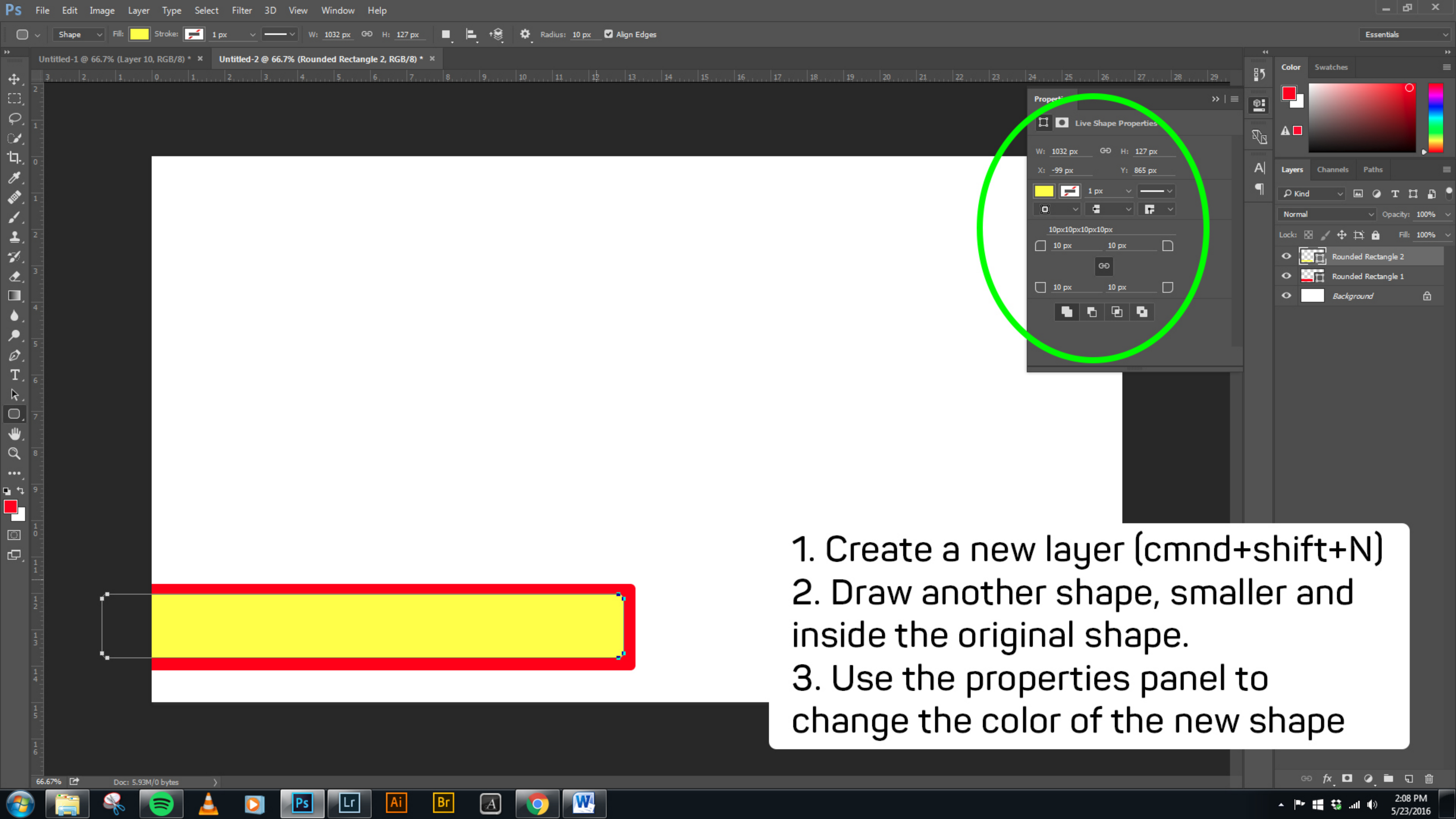




Click and hold the “Shapes” tool to see a list of the available shapes you can make.

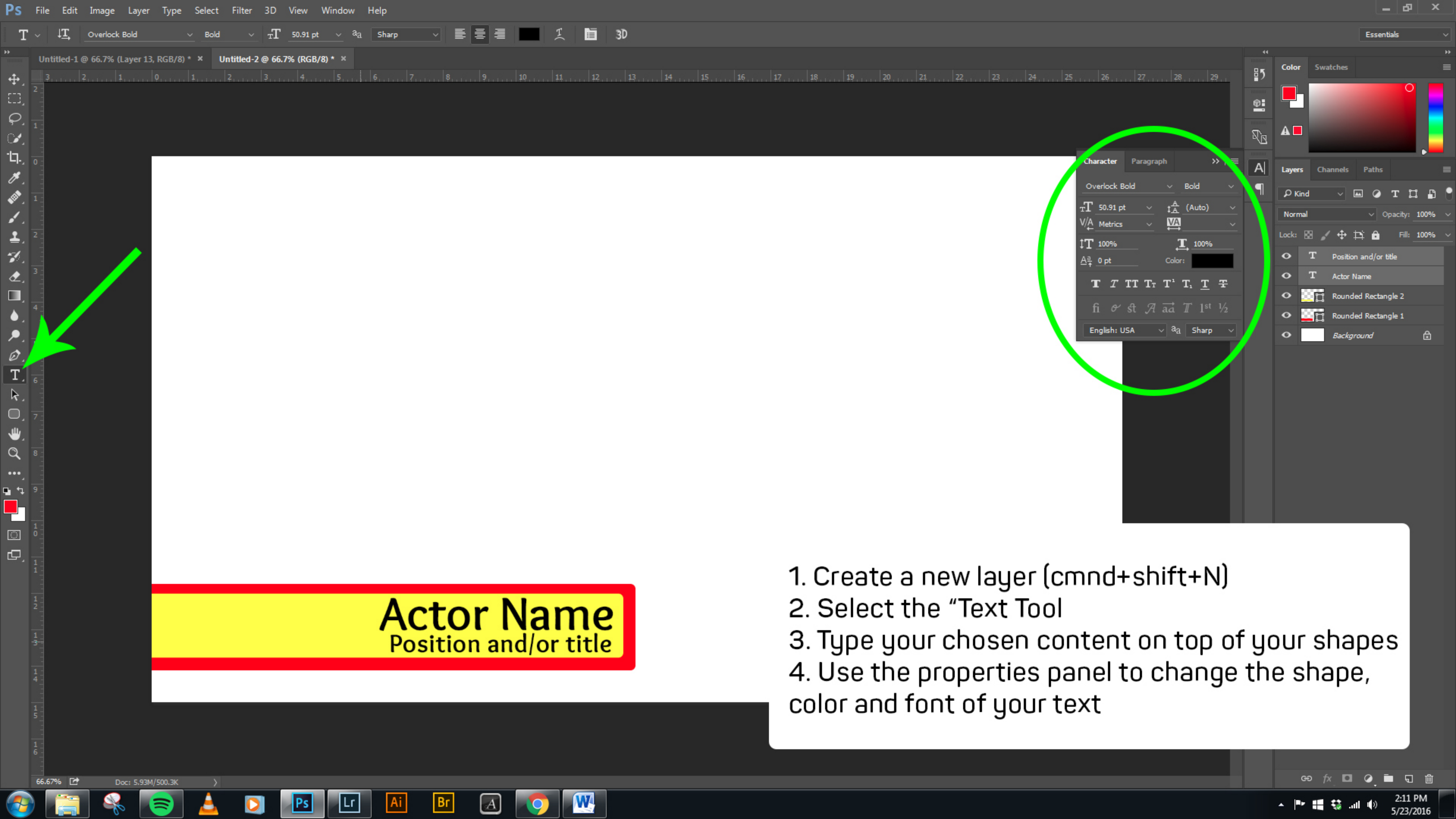


Draw a shape by clicking and dragging in your artboard (the large white rectangle)



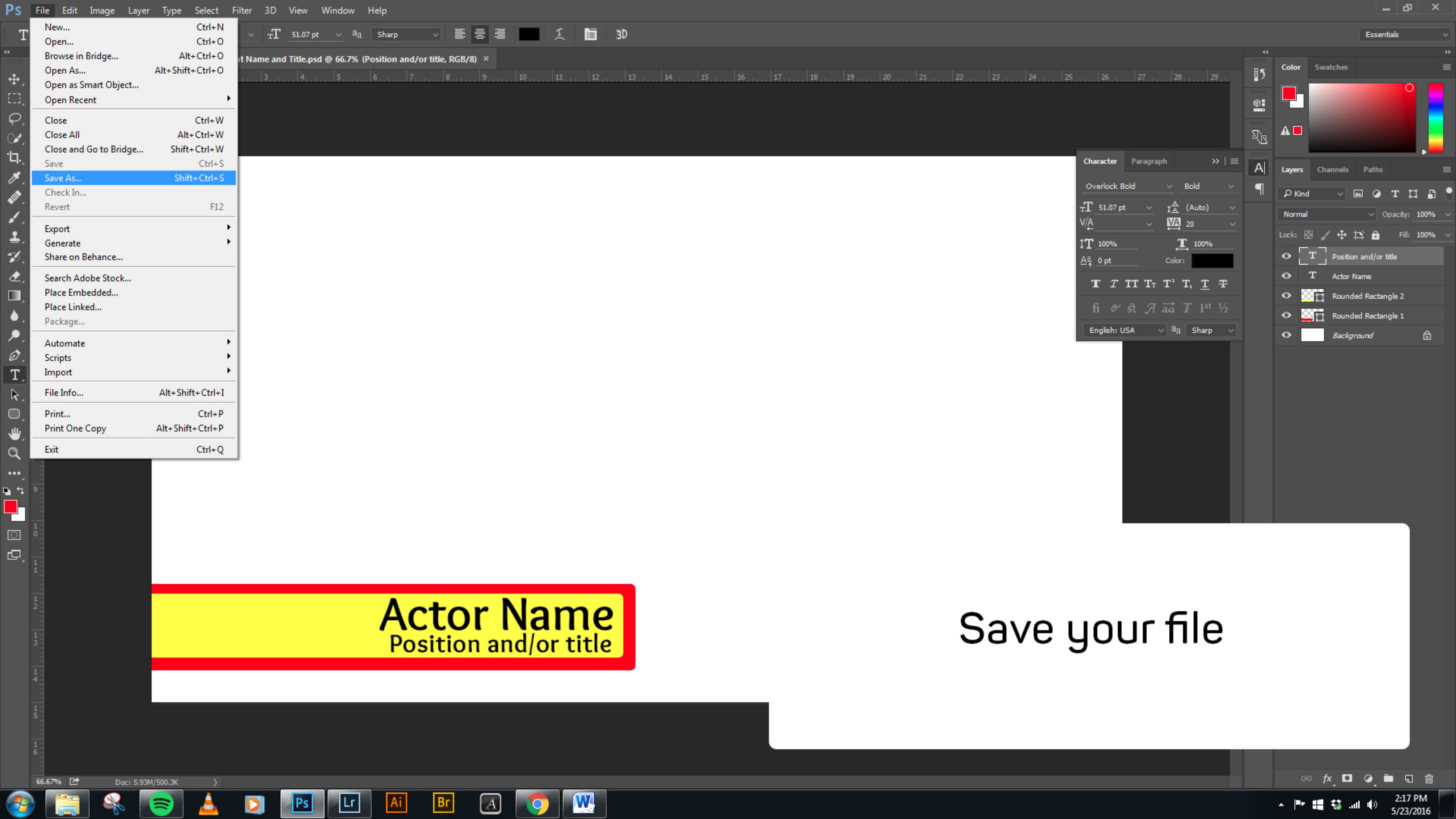
1. Create a new layer (cmd+shift+N)

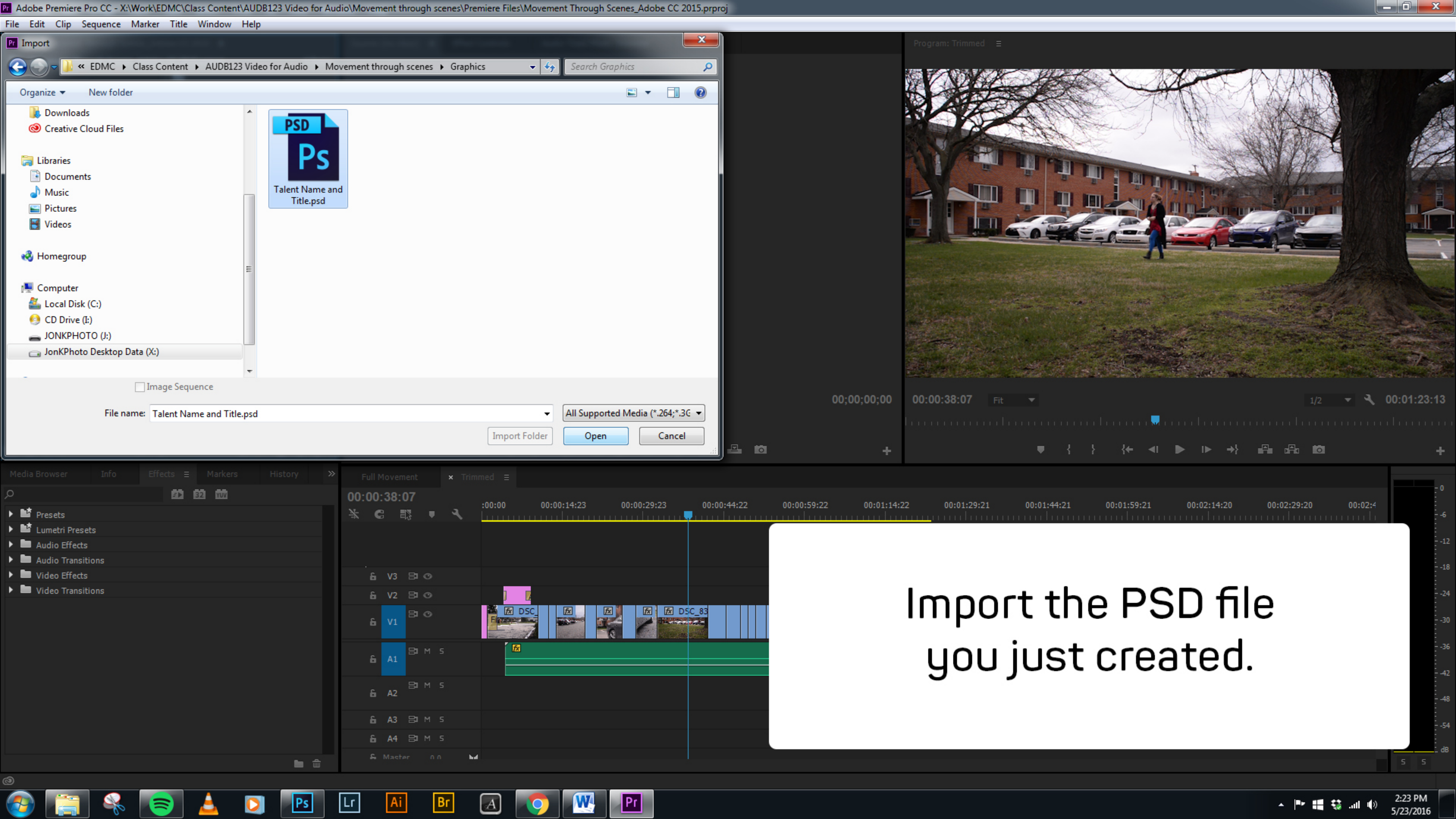




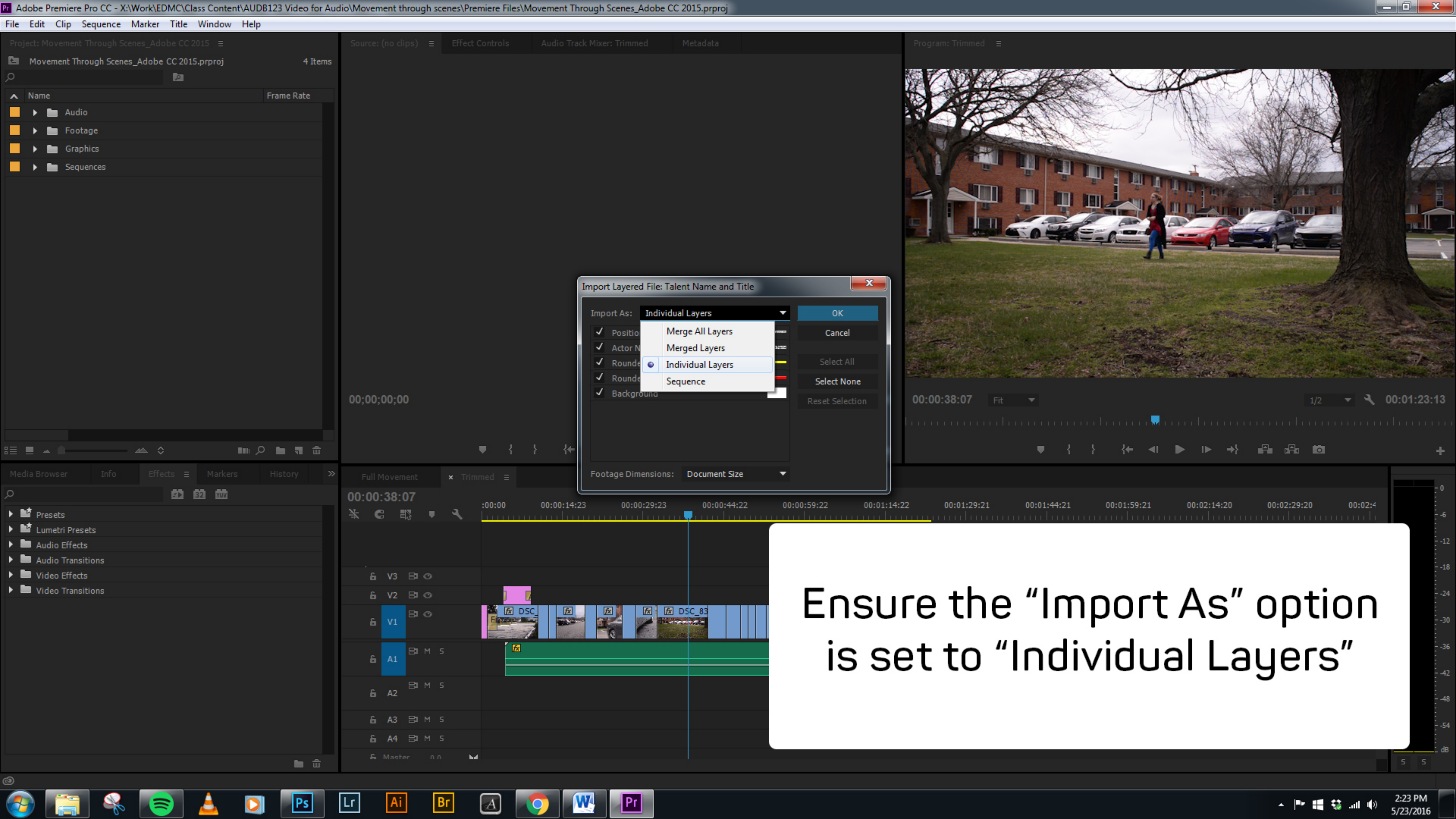


In Premiere, navigate to:  
File --> Import



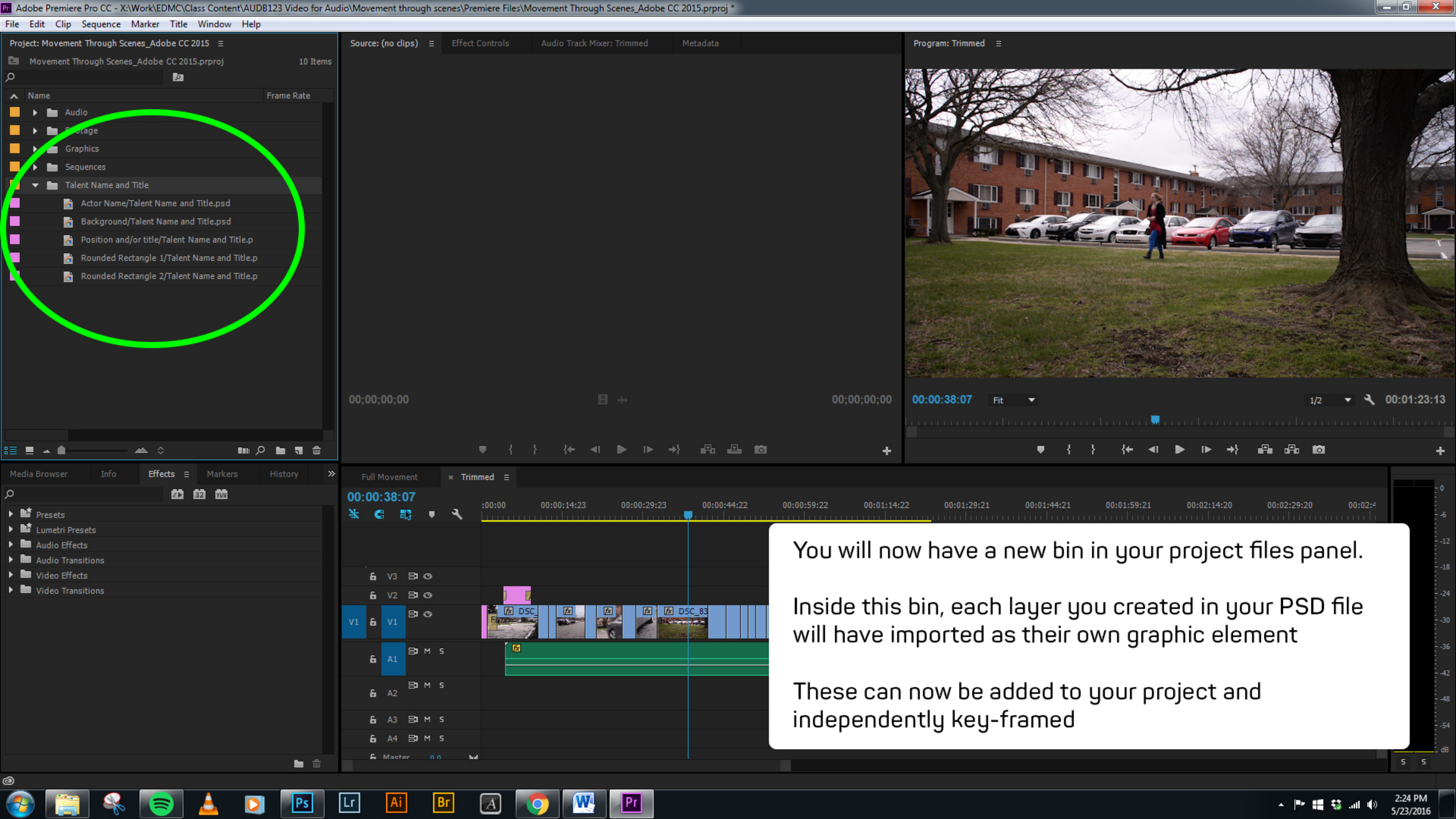






Ensure the "Import As" option is set to "Individual Layers"
